We have now vaccinated over 61% of eligible patients for the flu vaccine, and 65% of covid-vaccine eligible patients, in addition to vaccinating all eligible care and house bound patients. These phenomenal numbers are the result of 6 full-day vaccine clinics across the Peninsula.

## **Highways**

The result from the Highways Survey on Ford Hill by SCC were disappointing as they contradicted the test results from the ANPR, which were considerably higher. The ANPR data showed that 50% of traffic was travelling at 31+ mph whereas the average speed reported by SCC was 27-29 mph. The likelihood for this disparity is because Highways focused on the bridge rather than the approaches to it. This data is unlikely to convince Highways of the need for a 20 mph speed limit in the area though.

### **Lottery Fund Donation**

Chairman Ray Kay's bid for Lottery Funding has been successful and the council are delighted to report that they have been awarded £8,000 to spend on playground maintenance and new equipment. Councillors are planning to purchase some equipment for older children in the New Year.

# **Playground**

Cll PS reported that grass cutting and weed control has been completed for this year and CGM have provided a good service so they will be asked to quote for the same contract for next year. The recent RoSPA report identified a number of medium risk areas in the playground that require some maintenance. Councillors agreed that REJB should be asked to provide a quote for doing all the work as it could be funded using part of the Lottery Funding money allocated for maintenance.
