## Vicar's Voice February 2022

I guess the most important date we think of in February is the 14<sup>th</sup>. Yet there are a number of special dates for people in this month.

The church begins the month with Candlemas, or the presentation of Jesus in the temple by his mother

Mary and earthly father, Joseph as according to Jewish rite.

Then there is the Blessing of the Salmon nets in Northumberland, where close to midnight on 14th February, fishermen gather on the banks of the River Tweed when local vicar blesses the nets and boats. The fishermen then set out to make their first catch of the season.

And of course, when it comes to marriage, proposing has always been seen as the gentleman's prerogative, but once every four years Leap Year tradition has it that on the 29th of February, women can ask their loves to marry them.

But where did this tradition begin? it's believed to have started in <u>Ireland sometime during the 5th century</u>. Saint Brigid of Kildare, arguing that women were languishing away waiting for their shy beaux to pluck up the

nerve to pop the question, asked Saint Patrick to give a day they might do the deed themselves. A little negotiating was involved, with Saint Patrick first suggesting every seven years, but eventually 4 years was settled on. Love feels no burden, thinks nothing of trouble, attempts what is above its strength, pleads no excuse of impossibility.




It is therefore able to undertake all things, and it completes many things and warrants them to take effect, where he who does not love would faint and lie down.

#### **Building Affordable Homes Starts for PVCLT**

Peninsula Villages Community Land Trust (PVCLT) is pleased to announce that building work of four affordable homes at School Lane Bawdsey has at last started. They are due to be completed and occupied

by Spring 2023. After a difficult year with delays caused by Covid and legal issues, the Trustees are delighted that at last the CLT can now look for local people who could enjoy an affordable home and stay in the area. PVCLT was set up in 2018 with Trustees from the local parishes. The aim of the CLT is to work with housing developers to provide affordable homes for people who either live or have a strong connection with the villages on the Deben Peninsula. The site at School Lane will have a total of 13 homes 4 of which are affordable homes to rent. The four homes comprise of two 2 bed and two 1 bed. They are owned by PVCLT and will be a community asset forever. # **Shottisham Campsite**

The Blue Rabbit Cafe has some very exciting news. We have been awarded a very generous grant from East Suffolk Council via their Plan for the Future scheme to

help develop the cafe. We have been able to buy a converted container that will provide temporary indoor seating space for the cafe so there will be somewhere warm and dry for people to sit while having a coffee or a meal. Attached are some photos of the conversion in progress. The container should be arriving some day soon and definitely in time for the big cafe re-opening in April. (If anyone is worried, we have done our due diligence and we have permission from East Suffolk Council planning department for the container). The grant has also allowed us to buy a fabulous new espresso machine so you will be able to get delicious espresso, cappuccino and lattes at the Blue Rabbit to have with your home-made cakes and cookies. As a result of East Suffolk Council funding for this project we are excited to announce that the Blue Rabbit will be opening for breakfast/brunch and lunch from April onwards. We are committed to providing a farm-to-fork experience for customers and as usual our meat, vegetables, fruit and eggs are all grown right here on the



campsite smallholding. We will be selling home-made soup, sandwiches and toasties (with ham from our rare-breed pigs as well as vegetarian and vegan options), home-made tarts and quiches and a selection of seasonal salads as well as the usual Blue Rabbit cakes. There will also be home-baked waffles, croissants,



French toast, bacon sandwiches etc for late breakfasts or brunch. Opening times will

be 9.30-1.30 at weekends and we hope to expand to weekday opening too. 
