


# Shottisham Village Newsletter



## Vicar's Voice

Pentecost, or more as it is often better known, Whitsun, could be considered the Cinderella of Christian churches. In recent years, people rarely make much of this festival. Yet Pentecost is perhaps one of the most exciting of the church festivals, because it marks the moment when the church was born! Pentecost is celebrated as the Church's birthday, the day that God sent the Holy Spirit to inspire and empower ordinary Christians to do extraordinary things for Him. The Holy Spirit is given freely to all of us as a free gift from God. Jesus promised his disciples that we would receive this gift so that we might know his presence with us as we live out our faith on a daily basis.

*"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another comforter to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you..." - John 14:15-16*

The problem is when most of us think of comfort we think of the luxuries of life, like being wrapped up in a warm blanket or duvet when it's cold, fine dining and fine wine, an exotic holiday away from the strains and stresses of every day. We also think of comfort as something that consoles us when we are upset or in need. Whilst all these things are true, the word used in the New Testament has a completely different meaning to those we might expect. The word comfort is the same word that we find in relation to strengthening or stirring into action. The Bayeux Tapestry has a wonderful panel of Bishop Odo, forcing his men into battle, with the words which when translated means: "Here, Bishop Odo, comforts his troops." The Holy Spirit also empowers us to be the people God created and knows us to be, it fills us with God's wisdom and power for the tasks which he has called us to. On the day of Pentecost it is the Holy Spirit that takes the group of timid and bewildered disciples and equips them to declare the gospel message. Jesus before his Ascension had promised them that they would receive the Holy Spirit to equip them as His witnesses throughout the world.

*"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."*

- Acts 1:8

This power that comes with the Holy Spirit is there for us just as it was to the first disciples. It is power to live our lives as God intended, power to encourage us and to strengthen us for acts of service.

As we celebrate 70 years of service from Our Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth this month, one thing she has repeatedly said on many occasions, is how her faith has strengthened and encouraged her through all the changing scenes of her reign.

So as Pentecost approaches perhaps we need to think better of this often overlooked Christian Festival and celebrate the birthday of the church with a bit more style and flair! Maybe with a party, with balloons and cake too.

May the Spirit, who set the Church on fire upon the Day of Pentecost, bring the world alive with the love of the risen Christ.

### **Elect a chair:**

Councillor Peter Widdup proposed that Councillor Ray Kay continue as Chairman for 2022-2023 and thanked him for all his hard work as chairman last year. This was seconded by Councillor Patricia Southgate and carried unanimously.

### **Public Forum:**

A parishioner wished to express their thanks to Councillor James Mallinder for the very good job that he is doing as our local councillor. His care of the community and the environment is much appreciated as is his generosity towards funding local projects. Parishioners feel very lucky to have him.

### **Update on Highways Issues**

Councillor Peter Widdup reported that following his meeting with Suffolk County Council the white lines and the SLOW sign approaching Ford Hill from Sutton have now been repainted. He was disappointed to note that this repainting did not extend to the SLOW sign in The Street.

### **Update on Playground Issues**

- **Maintenance issues**

Most of the issues that were highlighted on the inspection report have now been rectified. Andrew Frost's team have made a good job of fixing the posts up to the fort and installed a small anchor post on the loose post on the agility trail. Thanks go to Steve Crane for fixing bolt caps on most of the equipment that required them.

- **Football nets**

A company has been found who are able to provide robust, professional nets that should last for up to ten years if treated properly, at a cost of £89 plus VAT. Councillors agreed to purchase another set of nets in the hope that these might prove stronger and last longer than previous versions.

- **Installation of new play equipment**

The new play tractor has now been installed between the picnic tables and the toddler swings. Installers took away all the rubbish with them and came back to install the two hub caps that were missing from the original order.
