

Dear Resident

I am delighted to be back as your district councillor, especially when the majority of Suffolk coastal councillors lost their seats

The council now stands as 16 green. 15 conservative, 12 labour, 11 lib dem and 1 independent. Greens and Lib dem are likely to be in coalition and we will see how that develops

I will of course be keeping them in check especially in continuing the focus on the environment - water quality and biodiversity in particular and making sure decisions benefit our community

Over the last year I pushed hard to implement a number of important initiatives, small changes perhaps but the start of a bigger impact. Small electrical recycling bins, allocation of spring bulbs under our East Suffolk blooms campaign and an increase in the number of pardon the weeds sites. Much work continues in Lowestoft to deliver improvements – third crossing, sea defences and beach huts.

I have been chair of the Suffolk Waste Partnership for a number of years and have worked hard with officers to investigate and prepare for new collection streams, bins and vehicles.

I hope very much my vision of environmentally sustainable communities continues and will make sure I continue to lobby Suffolk County Council, our MPs and all stakeholders to support these aims.
