
Shottisham Village Newsletter

Shottisham WI


Are you new to the area, or find you have time on your hands?

All the current (6) members of the PC are required to resign in May, some have indicated an intention not to stand for a further term. In particular Pat Southgate who has ably looked after the Play Area for some years will not be re standing, she will be missed.

With the exception of one Councillor the average age of the current Parish Councillors is in excess of 70 years, we desperately need new blood. Meetings are six times a year.

DEFIBRILLATOR

The PC was recently advised that an attempt to use the defibrillator at the Sorrel failed as the box could not be opened, instead the Sutton unit was acquired although did not need to be used. The unit was originally acquired by Gary Miller who matched village donations.

After much investigation it appears that no-one took over responsibility for the unit when it was acquired nor was it registered with the Ambulance Service. The unit is now registered and access to the combination code can be found by calling 999. Alternatively the code is in the Sorrel kitchen when available or from any Parish Councillor. New Pads are on order as the existing ones are out of date, we are also checking on whether the unit needs a software upgrade.



They quickly developed friendships with people in the village, many of whom had shared interests in the church, animals, and gardening. Both Pat and Mark were trained in Horticulture and gardening was her passion. Mum very much enjoyed her charity work, such as the Mother Theresa group and was busy with four children and a menagerie of animals. On retiring from the Prison service, they moved to Shottisham Rectory where Mark was Priest in Charge on the peninsula. Pat always talked about how happy their time was in Shottisham where she supported Mark in his work and enjoyed a lovely garden and hobbies such as beekeeping.
