Dear Friends in Christ,

This is Church letter for the month of April I am the Resurrection and the Life April is so named because it means 'opening up', as you see everywhere, the earth is awakening after the winter to produce new flowers and fruit! May I share with you some thoughts which have inspired me about this special April time coming as it does immediately after Easter Day, the greatest of all 'feasts', the dawn of the Light, in which we may rediscover "Christ is risen indeed" (in our hearts), and may discover "He has swallowed up death in victory", affirmed so powerfully when after raising his dear friend Lazarus revealed, "I AM the Resurrection and the Life" (St. John 11.25). Jesus had previously said I AM the bread of Life. The I AM reflecting the name of God in Exodus(3.14), "I AM That I AM". Jesus then five more times affirms, I AM the Light of the world(8.12,48,51), "I AM the Door" (10.9), "I AM the Good Shepherd" (10.11,14), "I AM the Way the truth and the Life" (14.6), and finally "I the Vine" (15.15). This marks the most celebrated time in the Christian year, when we commemorate the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. Though we call it Easter, most of the world knows it as **Pascha**, which is related to the Hebrew Pesach, or Passover; "Resurrection," because that is what it celebrates, to Life or judgement. Life through death(to selfishness), presupposed by resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus Christ, the miracle of miracles, the truth of the scriptures. The resurrection of Jesus bears witness to God's love for us. It testifies that God accepted the sacrifice of his own son and that we can become one with God because Jesus has taken away the sin that separated us from Him, reconciled us to God. When Easter dawns in our heart, we are filled with joy, so much joy that we cannot keep it to ourselves, it bubbles over in its fullness. This news is too good to keep to ourselves! This news is life-changing! When we realise that God became man to set us free from death of sin to bring us to resurrection, to Life. This glorious news, that He has swallowed up death, by revealing to us 'He in whom we live and move and have our being.' He reveals for us, if we can be still and reflect in "the peace of God which passes all understanding," and yet is our true nature, since we are made in the

image of God. Therefore, we have the means to find and share the unending joy and delight in God forever! As we practice to "be still and know that "I AM God", the Lord brings about the salvation, encouragement, and blessing. He is risen! He is risen indeed In the truth and power of the resurrection. At this time, I remember with profound thanks the love my father showed me, when the body was dying of cancer, and his last words were, 'Rejoice in the Lord always'. As we reflect after Easter Sunday, we gratefully celebrate the Resurrection, the rising again of the waves of His infinite love. May we be blessed with peace, hope, and light as we seek to follow and find ways to discover the Saviour of the World in our heart and the heart of all. May the Peace of God which passes all understanding keep your hearts in the knowledge and love of God, and of His Son Jesus Christ. And as we discover more that 'in as much as you do let your light of selfless love nourish those around you , you do it unto **Me.** And the Blessing of God Almighty, the Father , the Son and the Holy Ghost, be with you now, and especially at this beautiful Easter time, ever more. Amen.
