Clerk's actions

Over the last two months the clerk has:

- 1. Set-up the new .gov.uk email address for the clerk using web mail but will continue to link it to the old gmail account until all contacts have been notified of change.
- 2. Contacted Santander to find out how to switch over to online banking with them.
- 3. Organised a Peninsula Parish Council meeting in Shottisham at the Trust Hall on Thursday 7th September.
- 4. Contacted the Community Payback Scheme on the 7th August to nominate Shottisham for an offenders' project and suggested repainting the fence and posts in The Street could be a suitable project.
- 5. Sourced a new ASUS laptop to purchase on Amazon Business for £483.32 (excl VAT). This is likely to require an annual subscription for Microsoft 365 Business Standard at £10.30 (excl VAT) a month.
- 6. HMRC have sent the clerk a penalty letter for failure to file PAYE returns on time which has resulted in a fine of £200. The clerk has been unable to contact HMRC either online or by phone to query the penalty.

Financial Report:

- 1. At close of business on 03/09/2023 the current account stood at £13,671.89 of which a total of £2,277.59 has been paid out of the £3,000 playground maintenance fund. This includes labour and materials.
- 2. The clerk's wages for this month were £350 which includes £70 which will be paid to HMRC for the 20% income tax accrued.
- 3. An invoice for £40 has been received from Shottisham WI for the Trust Hall for September's meeting.
- 4. An invoice for £56.10 has been received from East Suffolk Council for May's election expenses.
- 5. An invoice for £144 has been received from CGM for grass cutting in August.
- 6. An invoice for £288 received from CGM for grass cutting in July was paid out on the 8th August.
- 7. An invoice for £350 received from suffolk.cloud for email accounts was paid out on the 8th August.
- 8. An invoice for £625.24 received from Ray Kay for playground maintenance was paid out on the 8th August.
